# **Author Spotlight: Joe R. Lansdale**

#### (Mystery, Suspense, Western, Horror, Science Fiction)

You do not need to look far to find prolific East Texas storyteller, Joe R. Lansdale. The author of more than forty novels (and numerous short stories) calls Nacogdoches home.

Because Lansdale is comfortable writing in a variety of genres, his works are an eclectic mix of mystery, suspense, horror and western (and that's usually in one novel!). The Edgar Award -winner has had several of his novels and stories adapted for film and television, including Bubba Ho-Tep, Incident off a Mountain Road, and Cold in July, which was nominated for the Grand Jury Prize at the Sundance Film Festival. "Hap and Leonard," based on characters from Lansdale's Hap and Leonard series, is scheduled to premiere on Sundance TV in early 2016.

His novels, for the most part, are set primarily in East Texas. Freezer burn, A fine dark line, Sunset and sawdust, Edge of dark water, and The thicket feature the Piney Woods as a backdrop; Livingston has made several brief appearances in his novels as well.

Lansdale's skill as a storyteller is matched only

by his skill as a martial artist; he is the founder of Shen Chuan Martial Science, and manages his own martial arts studio.

Lansdale, who is the writer in residence at Stephen F. Austin State University, lives in Nacogdoches with his wife, dog, and two cats.
