In the months leading up to the summer reading program, Livingston Municipal Library is offering many exciting events and programs.

Yoga classes begin on March 5 at 10:30am. These classes, which are appropriate for any age and body type, will continue each Monday until May 1. If you're looking for a unique, relaxing way to get into shape, these classes are right for you!

Green is the theme for **Toddler Time** and **Story** Time! On March 13 (10:30am), toddlers are invited to bring their favorite teddy bears and wear green, and on March 14 (10:30am), children can also wear green and enjoy stories and crafts inspired by St. Patrick's Day.

Julian Franklin joins us again on March 15 at 10:30am to present his "Book Bash" program. Franklin combines story time, magic show, and puppetry to celebrate reading. All ages are invited to attend.

The Pushing the Limits book discussion series continues with a talk on Geobiologist Hope Jahren's Lab Girl. Park Ranger Joel Janssen will lead the discussion, which will focus on themes including humility, passion, and curiosity as they relate to plants and biology. The discussion will be held on March 26 at 5:00pm.

Beginning on April 2 and running through April 27, the "Annexation: Celebrating Texas Statehood" exhibit will be on display at Livingston Municipal Library. This free exhibit highlights Texas as a colony of Mexico, an emerging republic, and its campaign to join the United States. The Wright Brothers, by David McCullough, will strength and balance be the focus of the **Pushing the Limits** discussion on May 21 at 5:00pm. The story of the two men who brought the art of flight to the world is sure to be informative and engaging.

Author Spotlight: Conn Iggulden

Historical Fiction

Conn Iggulden, born in 1971, studied English at the University of London, and taught the subject for seven years at a secondary school before deciding to make writing his full-time career. "I have written for as long as I can remember," Iggulden said. "It's what I always wanted to do."

He left teaching and wrote his first novel, *The gates of Rome*, in 2003. This novel was the first in the five-book Emperor series chronicling the life of Julius Caesar. Since then, Iggulden has written two other historical series, including the Conqueror series, about Genghis and Kublai Khan, as well as the War of the Roses series, a fictionalized account of the English war between the House of York and the House of Lancaster. Titles in this series include *Stormbird* (2014), *Margaret of Anjou* (2015), *Bloodline* (2016) and *Ravenspur* (2017).

Iggulden has a preference for historical fiction not only as a writer, but as a reader as well. "I have always loved historical

fiction as a genre, and cut my teeth on Hornblower and *Tai-Pan*, Flashman, Sharpe and Jack Aubrey," Iggulden said. "I suppose the one thing that links all those is the love of a good tale."

In addition to his popular historical fiction, Iggulden, with the help of his brother, Hal, has also written a successful series titled *The dangerous books for boys*, described as a guidebook for boys from age 8 to 80.

The first book in his new fantasy series, *Darien: Empire of salt*, was published in 2017.

Iggulden currently lives in England with his wife and their four children.
