Don't miss the Advanced Drawing Workshop on March 2 (11:00am). Registration is required, so be sure to call the library at 936.327.4252 to reserve a spot.

A Kids Crafternoon (March 11, 1:30pm) will kick off an exciting Spring Break. On March 12 (1:30pm-3:30pm) join us for a showing of the popular Dream-Works film *Kung Fu Panda* 3.

On March 13 (10:30am), multi-faceted storyteller Kim Lehman will join us again to present her popular program, "The Buzz about Bees". This interactive program will include honey tasting, bee biology with microscopes, a metamorphosis game, as well as a "Bee a Beekeeper" activity. The program is sponsored in part by The Texas Commission on the Arts.

Kids can explore their creativity and write their own stories in a free Comics Workshop (March 13, 2:00pm-4:00pm). The activity is limited to children and teens age 8 and up. Space is limited, so please call 936.327.4252 to register.

# **Author Spotlight: Walter Mosley**

(Literary Fiction/Crime Fiction)

The son of an African-American father and a Jewish mother. Walter Mosley describes being an only child as an "emptiness in my childhood that I filled up with fantasies."

Although Mosley, who was born in 1952, was raised in a non-political family, he later became outspoken on racism in the U.S., which forms the basis for much of his literary work.

His first novel, Devil in a blue dress (1990), introduces readers to Ezekiel "Easy" Rawlins, a black private investigator and WWII veteran living in Los Angeles during the 1940s-1960s. There are currently 14 novels in the bestselling Easy Rawlins series, including Black Betty, Six easy pieces, and Charcoal Joe.
