



To start summer reading off on a sweet note, we will host an **Ice Cream Social** on **June 1** (1:30pm-3:30pm). Make plans to come in and pick up your reading logs or activity charts, and enjoy a cool treat!

Join us on June 5 (10:30am-11:30am) for "Animals Rock with Lucas Miller." The "singing zoologist" will ignite children's curiosity with a STEM-based presentation.

We'll venture out of the library and into **Pedigo Park** for our annual **Family Game Day** on **June 6** (**10:00am-11:30am**). Volunteers will be on hand to help kids show off their athletic skills and fishing abilities. Snacks and refreshments will be provided.

On June 13 (10:30am-11:30am), Sue Young will present "Read, Rock, and Roll," a program that will feature an original song and other musical activities. All ages are invited to attend.

Maria Ashworth will lead our **Story Time** on **June 20** (**10:30am-11:30am**). The hour will be filled with songs, music, art and storytelling of interest to infants and children up to 8-years-old.

For all of our young aspiring authors, Maria Ashworth will also hold a **Future Authors Workshop** on **June 20** (12:00pm-1:00pm). She will offer tips on transforming your ideas into books and creating a story arc. Ms. Maria will also offer a manuscript contest and three lucky winners from three age groups will be featured on her website. June 27 is Science Day at the library. Children will explore the science of music during Story Time at 10:30am. Later that day (1:00pm), the Houston Museum of Natural Science will present

Chevron on Wheels: Know Your Rocks. This program will introduce the concepts of rock classification with lots of interactive activities.

Join us on July 3 (11:00am) for a festive 4th of July party. Refreshments will be served and all ages are invited to attend.

Johnny Villarreal and The Edge of Imagination Station will offer kids the opportunity to create a music video during a two-day workshop on July 10 and July 11. On July 10 (1:00pm-5:00pm), children will plan the video shoot using cardboard props. On July 11 (11:00am-3:00pm), stop motion animation and rotoscope techniques will be used to shoot the video at the library. Popular storyteller Julian Franklin will join us on July 11 (10:30am-11:30am) to present his "Reading Rocks (with Socks and Fox)" program. This magic show will be entertaining, engaging and informative.

Children are invited to explore their artistic sides during an Artsy Story Time on July 18 (10:30am-11:30am). Craft supplies will be provided.

On July 25, July 26, and July 27, children can build using the library's Lego WeDo 2.0 robotic kits. Each day from 10:30am to 1:00pm, participants will work on a variety of unique projects. It will be the perfect way to cap off an exciting summer reading season!


Friends of the Library Book Adoption

Author Spotlight: Doreen Cronin

Children's Fiction

Although Doreen Cronin was encouraged to be a writer very early on, it was some time before she decided to heed that advice.

"It was my first grade teacher, Mrs. Cooper, who first told me I was a writer," Cronin said. Mrs. Cooper

gave her extra class writing assignments. However, Cronin, who grew up in Merrick, NY, wanted to become a police officer like her father, but decided she wasn't brave enough for the job.

After practicing law for several years, Cronin decided to write full time, and write she did! Since publishing her first book, *Click, clack, moo* in 2000, Cronin has written over 20

books for children. The *Click, Clack* series includes *Click, clack, peep, Click, clack, splish, splash,* as well as the holiday-themed books *Click, clack, boo!, Click, clack, Ho! Ho! Ho!,* and *Click, clack, moo: I love you.*

In addition to the very popular Bug Diary series (*Diary of a worm, Diary of a spider, Diary of a fly*), Cronin has also begun a new series of chapter books, *The Chicken Squad*. The latest book in the series, *Bear country*, will be published this summer and will continue the misadventures of plucky bird detectives Dirt, Sugar, Poppy, and Sweetie.
