To finish out the year, the **Livingston State Park** will present a program during Story Time on **Dec. 30**. Children will learn about the many species of mammals and reptiles found in our area.


In addition to the activities happening at the library, the City of Livingston also has several exciting events planned to celebrate the holidays including Hay Ride in the Park (Dec. 5 at Pedigo Park), Santa at Miss Effie's Cottage (Dec. 11 at 201 West Mill Street), Jingle Bell Fun Run and Walk (Dec. 12 at City Hall), and Hometown Christmas (Dec. 12 at City Hall).

The library will be closed for **inventory** from **Jan. 4 thru Jan. 16**. Although it is an inconvenience to our regular customers, it is beneficial because it gives library staff time to make sure that all of our books, DVDs and audiobooks are accounted for, so that the library's catalog information can be kept accurate.

Books will be on loan during that period, so cardholders are welcome to come in before New Year's Day and check out enough items (up to 30) to keep them busy during the closure. The library's exterior book drops (at the front entrance and in the parking lot) will remain open for those wanting to return books early.

The good news is that even though the library will be closed, our **OverDrive** service will still be available. If you have an eReader, tablet, or computer, you will still have access to the library's collection of eBooks and eAudiobooks. In addition, the TexShare databases will be available for those needing to do research or complete homework assignments. If you do not currently use Overdrive, please ask at the circulation for a step-by-step guide to get you started.
